Solapur is a tier-two city in the south-east of Maharashtra, and the administrative headquarters of Solapur district. It shares a border with Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh, and has therefore attracted a large migrant population from across southern India. Solapur is recorded to have the highest number of sugar factories in India, and also leads in 'beedi' production within the state. The city used to be an important centre for cotton textile manufacturing until recently and was the first to set up a waste-to-energy electricity plant in Maharashtra. Solapur is well connected by road to other important cities in the country and has a basic airport that mostly remains unused at present.

<p><u>Architecture of Governance</u> Structure of Elected and Executive Bodies. Give indication of hierarchies</p>	<p>Solapur city is governed by Solapur Municipal Corporation. The Corporation is headed by city Mayor who presides over the deputy Mayor and Corporators elected from each ward. The administrative wing is headed by Municipal Councillor. According to Cesus 2011, Solapur Municipal Corporation is divided into 98 wards.</p> <p>The important functions of the Solapur Municipal Corporation are assessment and collection of property tax, birth and death registration, building of municipal schools and primary health centres etc.</p> <p>The Maharashtra State has an independent Town Planning and Valuation department under the administrative control of the Urban Development and Public Health and Housing Department. It deals with important subjects of town planning and valuation of real properties. A branch office of the department under the control of the Town Planner was created in Solapur in 1960. In preparation of Master Plan and Development Plan of the city, Solapur Municipal Corporation also plays a significant role under the provisions of the Maharashtra Regional and Town Planning Act, 1966.</p> <p>The Pune Housing and Area Development Board, a regional unit of MHADA, holding territorial jurisdiction over 5 Districts in Pune Division namely; Pune, Kolhapur, Solapur, Satara, Sangli. It also implements govt. programme of providing housing under Lok Awas Yojana, VAMBAY Yojana, NSDP Yojana, IHSDP Yojana, BSUP Yojana, RGGNY Part- I & Part- II Yojana.</p> <p>Maharashtra Jeevan Pradhikaran (Water Supply and Sanitation Department of Maharashtra) is responsible for water supply and sewerage facilities in Solapur.</p>
