OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: - Follow up on Focus Group Meeting with Principal Secretaries (UD)/
State Mission Directors/ CEOs of SPVs/ Municipal Commissioners of
Smart Cities.

The undersigned is directed to invite attention to the Focus Group Meeting held on 22nd April, 2016 at 12:00 noon under the chairmanship of Secretary (UD) and to convey that after detailed discussions the following was agreed upon:

1. Institutional structures-

- (i) Cities should explore the possibilities of hiring CEOs and other Key Management Persons (KMPs) from the open market also so as to bring on board new skill sets that would be required for implementing the Mission.
- (ii) Project Management Consultants (PMC), combined or separated for Smart Solutions and Area-based, should be in position by end of May, 2016.
- (iii) A full time CEO should be appointed as early as possible.
- Quick win projects should be identified. Work on these has to be started by 25th
 June 2016- the first anniversary of the Launch of the Smart City Mission. A
 tentative list is enclosed. However, the quick win projects should not alter the
 overall integrated planning in the SCP.
- A realistic roadmap with timelines for implementation of modules and projects in the SCP should be developed by the SPV.
- Special efforts and prioritization should be carried out to make these lighthouse cities as open defecation free cities, having comprehensive waste management systems in place. Cities should also get affordable housing projects rolled out on priority basis.
- Cities should strive for leveraging the grant funds by looking at alternative funding sources such as Municipal Bonds, PPPs and get their credit ratings done from the agencies approved by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI). Credit rating for all smart cities should be completed expeditiously.

 Cities should come up with list of bankable projects which could be posed to multi-lateral agencies such as World Bank, Asian Develop Bank and BRICS Development Bank.
